**These are not the samples to be sent for testing. Those samples, with the \$7 testing fee for each, must be postmarked by August 1 in order to be sampled.*

Prizes

Winners of Junior and Senior garment category will attend the National MIWW Competition in January 2018, San Antonio, Texas.

Winner of the Adult garment competition will submit her/his entry and a DVD/thumbdrive containing images of the winner modeling the outfit to the National Adult MIWW judging event. (Garments will be returned to entrants by mail following judging). National adult winner is invited to attend the National Competition in January 2018, San Antonio, Texas.

Winners of the Preteen, Made for Others, Wearable Accessory, and Other Wool Art/Nonwearables will receive prizes as determined by the Virginia MIWW Committee.

Prizes may be changed based on participation or judges' and/or committee recommendations.

Virginia Make It With Wool will not be responsible for loss or damage to garments.

What are the judging criteria?

- Appropriate to contestant's lifestyle.
- Fit and overall appearance.
- Coordination of fabric/yarn with garment style and design.
- Contestant's presentation.
- Construction quality.
- Creativity in design and use of wool.
- Conveys/promotes the beauty, comfort, and versatility of wool.



Judging is private and the judges' decisions are final.

2. Send fabric/yarn samples for testing prior to August 1, 2017.
3. Send in your entry form and fabric samples (postmarked by August 15, 2017).
4. Watch your inbox for MIWW news.
5. Sew, knit, crochet, spin, weave, felt!
6. Attend the competition in September.

Why Make It With Wool?

Make It With Wool is an annual youth-centered sewing competition to promote the beauty and versatility of wool fabrics, yarns, and fibers. It is sponsored by the American Wool Council, the American Sheep Industry, and American Sheep Industry Women.

Wool is the uber natural fiber. This contest aims to encourage personal creativity in sewing, knitting, crocheting, spinning and weaving with wool fabrics and yarns; and in those personal creations highlight for the public the exceptional qualities of this superb fiber—its variety of types, textures, weaves and weights, adaptability to many construction techniques, versatility, and of course its beauty.

Who can enter?

Any Virginia resident may participate, regardless of race, creed, or gender, who meets age and other guidelines. Age of contestant on January 1, 2017:

Preteens (age 12 and under)
Juniors (ages 13-16)
Seniors (ages 17-24)
Adults (25 and older)



What can I enter?

All participants must select, construct, and model their own garment(s), with the exception of the Made for Others category (see below). All garments must have been completed after January 1, 2017.

Preteens may enter: Dress, jumper, skirt, pants, shorts, vest, sweater, shirt/blouse, jacket or a combination of garments.

Juniors, seniors, and adults may enter:

- **Single garment.** Dress, jumper, outerwear jacket, coat, or cape.
- **Two-piece outfit.** Outerwear coat, jacket, cape; blouse/shirt, vest or sweater with dress, jumper, skirt, pants or shorts.
- **Ensemble**--three or more garments worn together at one time. Outerwear coat, jacket, cape; blouse/shirt, vest and or sweater with dress, jumper, skirt, pants, or shorts.

- **Made for others.** Garments made for another person. The recipient must model the garment and the sewer/knitter/weaver/felter must answer the judges' questions. The garment categories are as above.
- **Wearable accessory.** Items worn to compliment a garment or outfit: a purse, hat, gloves/mittens, belt, tie, pin, scarf.
- **Other wool art/non-wearables.**



What fabrics and yarns may I use?

- 100% wool or wool blend (minimum 60% wool or specialty wool fiber) for each fabric or yarn used. Specialty wool fibers include alpaca, angora, camel, cashmere, llama, mohair, and vicuna.
- The entire garment body (back, front, and sleeves) must be wool or wool-blend fabric. Vests worn with a suit, sport coat, or blazer may have a back of non-wool fabric. Vests worn as a top layer or with outerwear coat/jacket must have a wool back.
- Trims, facings, linings, interfacings and underlining may be from fabrics other than wool or wool blends.

Testing of fabrics and yarns required

All wool fabrics and yarns must be tested for percentage of wool fiber. Contestants must send a 5-inch by 5-inch sample (pressed flat) of each fabric used (and may piece together smaller pieces to create the sample size). If your entry is knitted, crocheted, or hand-woven, attach a 5-inch by 5-inch sample and label from the skein. The testing fee is \$7 per sample.

Fabrics will be mailed for testing by the state director on:



**May 1, June 1,
July 1, August 1.**



Best to test before beginning your project! Allow a minimum of two weeks to receive test results.
